1796 Moses Cleaveland founded Cleveland and Euclid Township.
1803 Ohio admitted into the U.S.A.
1809 Euclid Township incorporated
1835 First resident priest of Cleveland, Father John Dillon sent by bishop from Cincinnati.
1840 Amadeus Rappe arrived in Ohio from France.
1847 Bishop Rappe founded Diocese of Cleveland.
1848 Cornerstone laid for St. John Cathedral.
1852 St. John Cathedral completed and consecrated.
1860 St. Paul's Church founded in Euclid, Ohio.
1902 St. Philomena Church founded.
1908 Holy Rosary Church founded.
1912 Woodrow Wilson elected President.
1915 St. Ann's Church founded.
1917 South Euclid incorporated.
1918 Edward C. Foote elected Mayor of South Euclid.
1920 Warren Harding elected President.
1921 Rev. Joseph Schrembs named Bishop of Cleveland.
1922 Maurice Riley organized St. Gregory the Great Parish. Church erected. Pope Benedict XV died. Pius XI elected Pope. Choir organized. Charles Havre elected Mayor of South Euclid.
1923 Altar and Rosary Society established Jan. 1923. President Harding died. Calvin Coolidge became President
1925 School started; two portables brought from St. Ann's Parish.
1926 Second portable building put to use. Gesu Parish established from St. Gregory's. Holy Name Society established September, 1926.
1927 Charles Lindbergh crossed Atlantic Ocean. First graduating class from St. Gregory School.
1928 Christ the King Parish established from St. Gregory's. Herbert Hoover elected President. C.H. Quackenbush elected Mayor of South Euclid.
1929 Rev. William P. Maxwell, from St. Gregory's ordained. Wall Street Crash. Admiral Richard Byrd flew over South Pole.
1930 Oliver H. Whigham elected Mayor of So. Euclid.
1932 Rockne Club started. Franklin Roosevelt elected President. Douglas Oviatt elected Mayor of South Euclid.
1933 Father Riley died. Father Neil Gallagher appointed new pastor.
1934 Midget football started at St. Gregory's.
1936 Two new portable school buildings added.
1938 Boy Scout program started.
1939 Father Gallagher died. Pope Pius XI died. Pius XII elected Pope.
1940 Father William C. Ring appointed new pastor.
1941 December 7, U.S.A. entered World War II.
1942 Senior Acolyte Club organized. Rev. Edward F. Hoban appointed first Co-adjutor Bishop of Cleveland.
1943 St. Francis of Assisi Parish established from St. Gregory's. PTA organized. First school cafeteria opened.
1944 St. Clare Parish established from St. Gregory's.
1945 Church chimney struck by lightning. Germany and Japan surrendered. World War II ended. President Roosevelt died. Harry Truman became President.
1946 Lloyd Reynolds elected Mayor of South Euclid.
1947 St. Louis Parish established from St. Gregory's. Father Ring died. Father Edward F. Gracey appointed pastor.
1948 Father Gracey resigned. First annual Funfest. George Urban elected Mayor of South Euclid. Rev. Achilles P. Ferreri appointed pastor. St. Margaret Mary Parish established from St. Gregory's.
1949 Ground broken for new school. Rev. Robert Bonnell from St. Gregory's ordained.
1950 Seventeen room school dedicated. Marble statue of Our Lady of Fatima arrived from Italy, enshrined in corner near playground. First kindergarten class started. Korean War started.
1952 Dwight Eisenhower elected President.
1953 St. Paschal Baylon Parish started from St. Gregory's, Kindergarten classes stopped. Korean War ended.
1954 St. Gregory Guild started. PTA disbanded.
1955 Convent dedicated. New school wing opened. Kindergarten classes restarted.
1956 Cub Scouting started. Kindergarten classes stopped.
1958 Pope Pius XII died. John XXIII elected Pope.
1959 Fund raising campaign started for new church. Rev. Carl D'Agostino from St. Gregory's ordained.
1960 Easter Sunday, ground broken for new church. John Kennedy elected president.

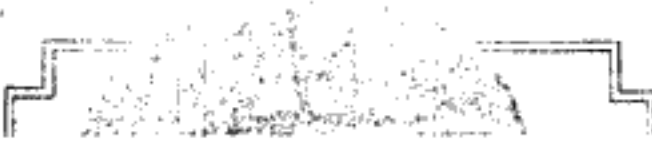

Headlines, May 22, 1927

- 1961 Cornerstone set for new church. Monsignor Ferreri died. New church opened. Father Stephen A. Towell appointed pastor. CYO football stopped at St. Gregory's.
- 1962 Church dedicated by Auxiliary Bishop Floyd Begin. Msgr. Ferreri's last sermon broadcast on Stations WERE, WABQ, WDOK, WGAR. Mr. Fred Hauserman and Mr. Carmen Artino received Knighthood in the Order of St. Gregory from Pope John XXIII. Vatican II started.
- 1963 Pope John XXIII died. Paul VI elected Pope. President John Kennedy assassinated. Lyndon Johnson became President. Prayers in English allowed at Mass. Music program started at school. Rev. Robert Pelton and Rev. John Kysela, both from St. Gregory's ordained.
- 1964. Rev. Clarence Issenmann named Co-Adjutor Bishop of Cleveland. U.S. heavily involved in Vietnam. Rev. Glenn E. Powell from St. Gregory's ordained. Monthly collection envelopes distributed for first time. Two envelopes per Sunday. Priests permitted to say Mass facing congregation.
- 1965 Sunday evening Mass permitted. Eucharistic Fast reduced to one hour. Vatican II ended.
- 1966 Lenten fast days reduced from forty to two. Rev. Bruce Stanton from St. Gregory's ordained.
- 1968 Richard Nixon elected President. Sunday evening Mass cancelled.
- 1969 Astronauts landed on moon. Our Lady of Fatima statue relocated. Rev. Lee Monroe from St. Gregory's ordained priest. Envelope system changed, only one per Sunday.
- 1970 Kent State riot, four students killed. Laymen permitted to distribute Holy Communion. Saturday evening Masses permitted.

- 1971 Groundwork laid for parish council. Arnold D'Amico elected Mayor of South Euclid
- 1972 Watergate scandal began. Golden Jubilee of St. Gregory's. Ground broken for new rectory.
- 1973 New parish rectory constructed, old house torn down. Vietnam cease-fire began, U.S. troops removed.
- 1974 Bishop Issenmann retired. James A. Hickey named Bishop of Cleveland. President Richard Nixon resigned. Gerald Ford became President. Special collection for Xenia, Ohio, tornado victims. Station WJW provided T.V. Mass for shut-ins on Sunday mornings.
- 1975 Father Stephen Towell retired. Coffee and donuts served after Mass. Bingo legalized in Ohio and at St. Gregory's.
- 1976 Msgr. William Novicky appointed pastor. Kindergarten classes restarted. Bicentennial celebrated. Jimmy Carter elected President. New face-to-face confessionals built. Parish renewal program started. Toddler room provided at Sunday Masses. Sound system modified in church. Special collection for Guatemalan earthquake victims. State Senator Anthony Calabrese presented St. Gregory School with a resolution in recognition of the Bicentennial History Fair.
- 1977 Rev. John Iammarino, from St. Gregory's, ordained. Msgr. Novicky's St. Bernard, Heidi killed. CYO football restarted at St. Gregory's. Elvis Presley died. Permission granted to receive Host in hand. Two live fig trees placed in sanctuary.

Hickey elevated to rank of Archbishop of Washington, D.C. Ronald Reagan elected President. Rev. George O'Hara appointed associate pastor.

1981 Auxiliary Bishop Anthony Pilla appointed Bishop of Cleveland. American hostages released from Iran. President Reagan and Pope John Paul II shot and wounded. Rev. Thomas Smith from St. Gregory's ordained. Anwar Sadat Assasinated.
